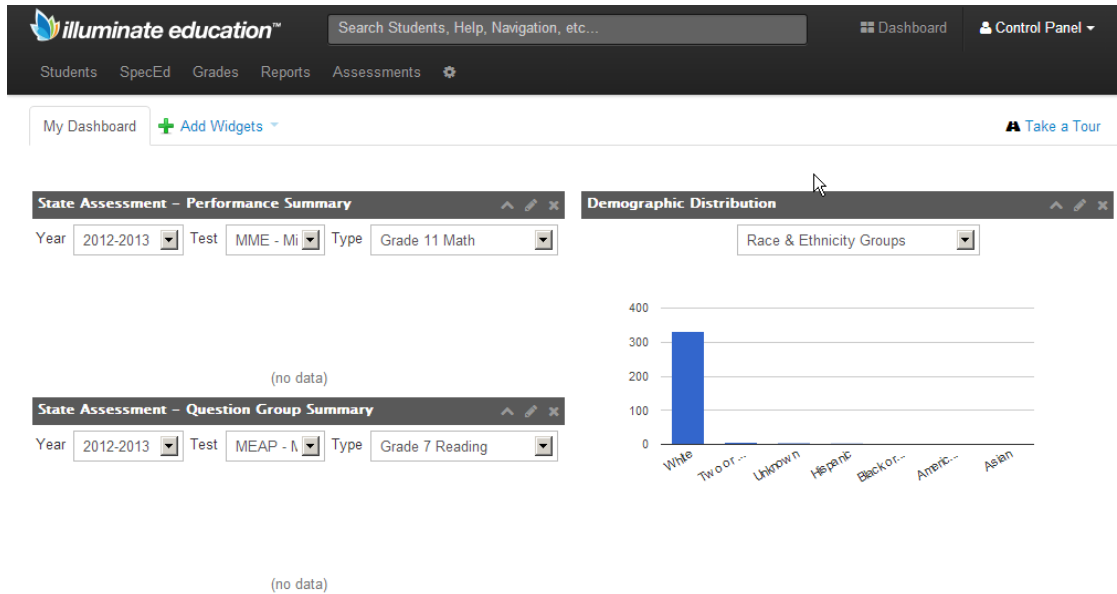


Using the Favorites widget in Illuminate to easily access reports

The Illuminate Dashboard can be customized to your liking with many different widgets. The Favorites widget can provide quick, easy access to reports you commonly use.

The Illuminate Dashboard can contain many useful widgets.

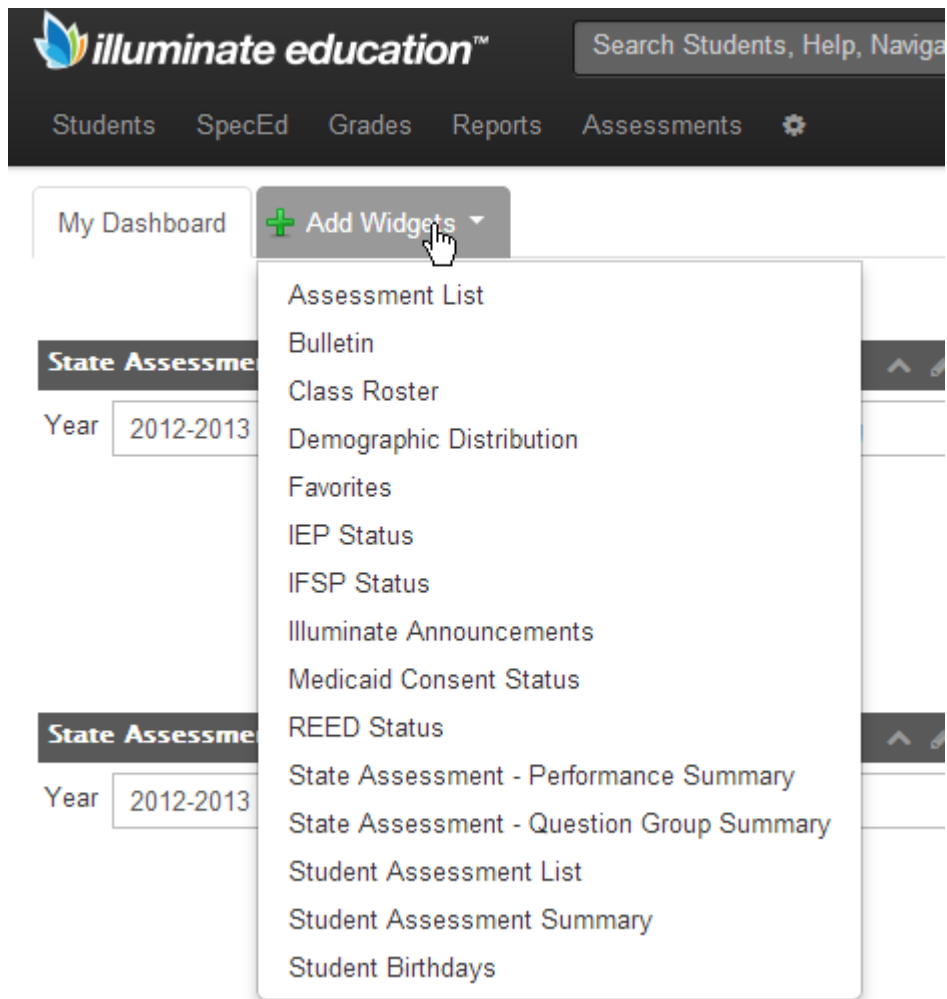
Adjust the placement of widgets on your dashboard

Dragging the widget from its original location

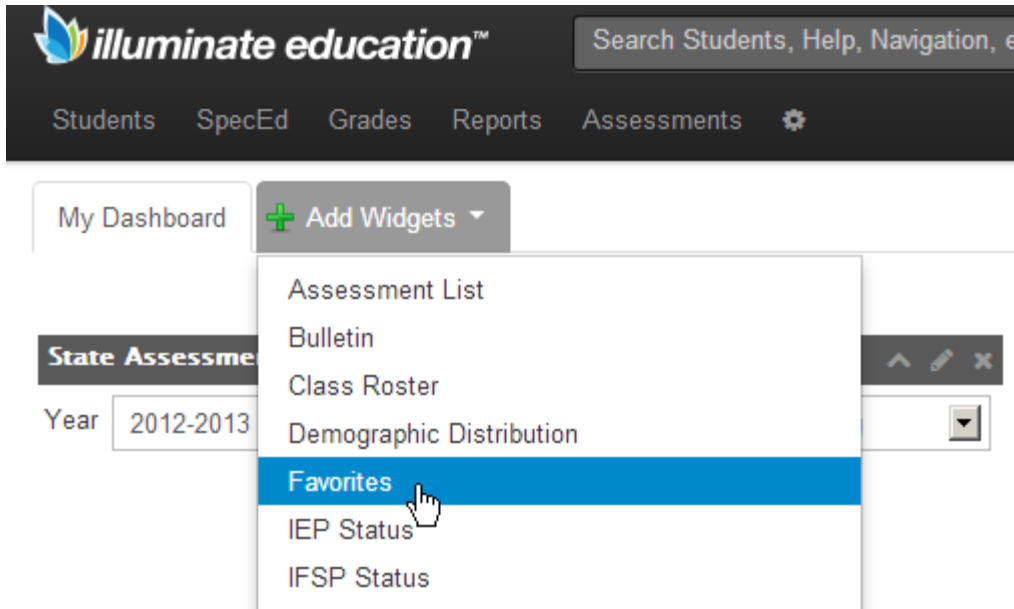
You can customize the arrangement of widgets on your dashboard by clicking in the widget's dark gray bar and dragging it to a new position. As you move the widget, yellow "drop zones" should appear. Release the mouse over one of these zones to change the widget's location.

Add new widgets



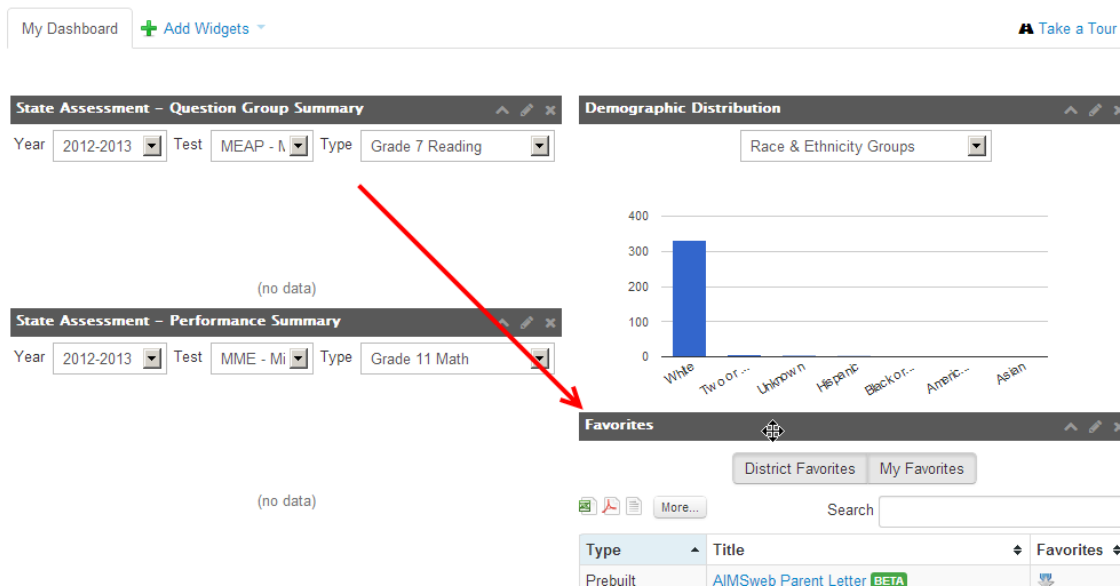
You can add new widgets to the dashboard by clicking the "Add Widgets" control. The new widget will appear at the bottom of the right column of your dashboard. You can place a maximum of eight widgets on your dashboard.

Add the "Favorites" widget to your dashboard




The default Illuminate dashboard does not include the Favorites widget. To add it to your dashboard, click the "Add Widgets" control, scroll down to "Favorites" and release the mouse.

Locate the Favorites widget



The new widget appears at the bottom of the right column of your dashboard. You may need to scroll your window down to access the new widget.

Show District Favorites





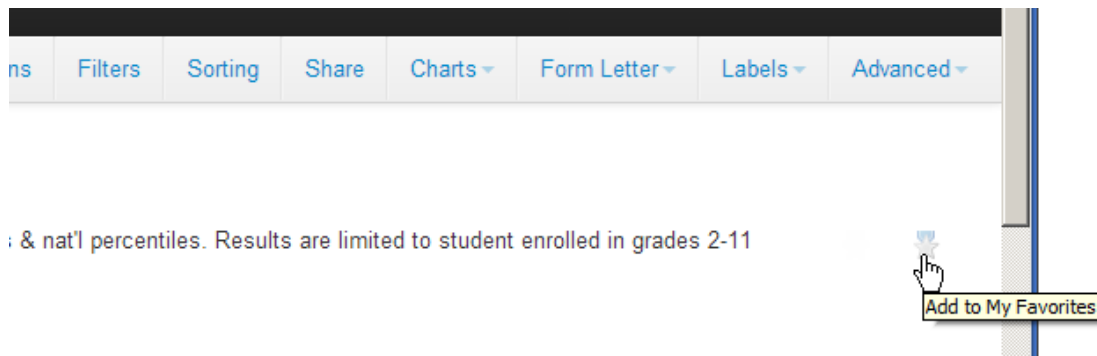

When the "My Favorites" button is selected, the widget will display the names of any reports you have identified as personal favorites. Note that you can include custom reports as well as prebuilt reports as favorites.

Identifying Favorites



Any time you are viewing a custom report or prebuilt, you can identify the report as a favorite by clicking the small medal icon in the top right corner of the screen. If you add the report as a favorite, it will appear on the My Favorites tab of the widget. To remove a report from the widget, access the report and click the medal icon again. This will remove it as a favorite.

Using the Favorites widget allows you to have your most informative and commonly-used reports available from the Dashboard with a single click of the mouse.
